"Partnering for the Future" Project Summary

Benefits for the Mountrail Bethel Home Chapel, Dietary, Shipping/Receiving and Transportation Center Project:
Slated for ground breaking in Spring of 2015
Project Cost: \$4.6 million dollars (est.)

- Add on square footage to allow for larger Chapel area/Multipurpose Room = Will allow for all residents to attend services and more room for families to gather.
- Remodel/expand dining area and kitchen = Will allow more room for residents at tables, update appliances in the kitchen and allow more room for staff to prepare meals.
- Shipping/receiving moved upstairs = Will allow easier distribution of supplies to the Bethel Home, Hospital & Clinic.
- Transportation Center = Will allow residents to be loaded in a covered area protected from the outside elements.

Benefits of the Emergency Room, CT Scanner and Ambulance Bay Project

Project complete—Total project costs being \$1.5 million

- Swap current ER room with current OR room = Will increase the number of ER beds available.
- Move nurse station by ER = Will be more efficient for the nursing staff.
- Add Decontamination Room = Will improve work force safety, improve patient care, and add an additional ER bed
- Enclosed Ambulance Bay = Will protect patients from weather elements when transported by ambulance.
- Move waiting room to front of hospital = Will improve patient family traffic flow & maintain confidentiality.
- Create registration area where old hospital nursing station was = Will improve visibility for registration, improve patient confidentiality and expand the area for business office staff.
- Add CT area to North end of ambulance bay = Will improve patient care and improve financials.

Benefits for the Expansion of the T.H. Reiarson Clinic:

Slated for completion in December of 2014

Project Cost: \$2.5 million (est.)

Greatest portion of the project is being paid for by a pledge from the Reiarson Trust

- Increase number of exam rooms = Will provide more efficient work space for current medical providers, increase clinic patients, able to add additional medical providers, improve financials for MCMC.
- Add break/meeting room area = Will allow for small patient/community meetings/staff meetings.
- Recruitment of medical providers = Will have space available for providers and be able to expand specialist visits, improve patient care provided in Mountrail County.
