

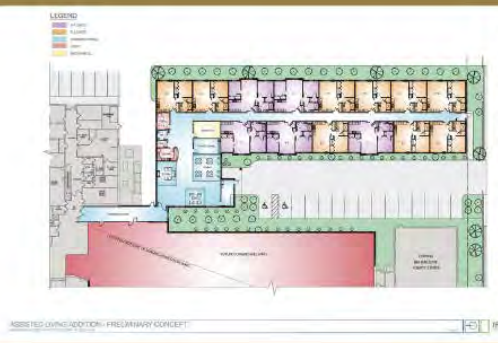

The Mountrail County Health Foundation of Stanley, ND was established November 22, 1991 and received their non-profit status a year later. The foundation was originally organized to generate charitable dollars from community members to assist with the increasing shortfalls of Medicare, Medicaid and Blue Cross reimbursements. The Foundation provides avenues through which donors can share in the philanthropic goals of the Mountrail County Medical Center and Mountrail Bethel Home of Stanley, ND. Cash gifts may also be pledged over a period of up to five years and are tax deductible from the donor’s adjusted gross income.

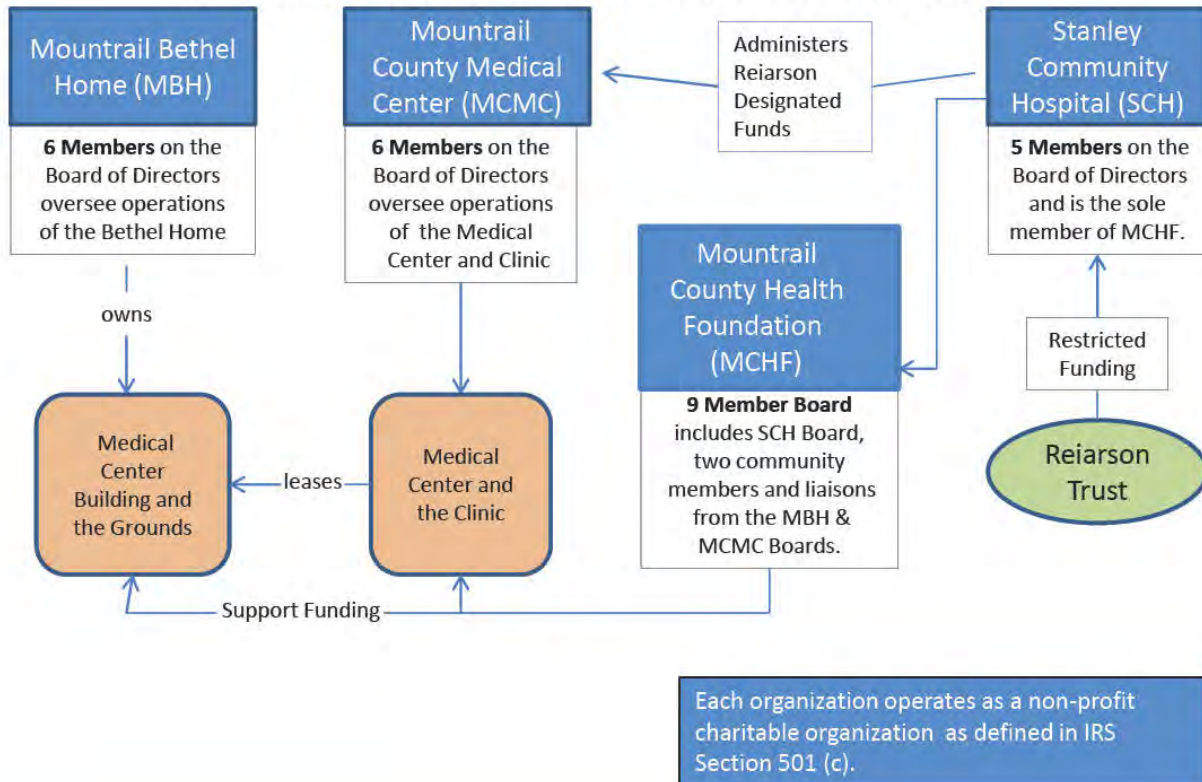

Nobody takes care of you like your own...

In 2015, area residents provided input for the Community Health Needs Assessment by completing surveys, giving interviews and participating in focus groups. In addition to helping identify community health needs, a group of community members also provided guidance to the hospital by ranking and prioritizing the identified needs. The group collectively ranked the top five health-related needs facing the community as:

In response to this, the Mountrail County Health Foundation sponsored several community events in 2017 in conjunction with a newly created monthly marketing plan. Every month the Providers, Clinic Manager and the Foundation Director met and planned an event around the Health Awareness for that month, focusing on health issues that were listed in our top five shown above. Bimonthly “Lunch and Learns”, a “Mini Health Fair” at the High School, events at Cash Wise, and a Summer Challenge program, “Get Off the Couch and GO!” were a few items planned and sponsored by the Foundation with help from the Stanley Public Schools, and Stanley Park District. The Foundation has also partnered with the local churches, Cash Wise, the Stanley Park District and the Stanley Public Schools and began a program to help with the fact that there are children in our area who are not getting the nutritious food they need on a regular basis. The Stanley Area Cares for Kids (S.A.C.K.) offers a supply of nutritious meals and snacks for children over their weekends and extended breaks, free of charge, during the school year.

And in response to the “Ability to recruit and retain primary care providers,” the Foundation sponsored six Stanley High School 7th and 8th Graders to attend Scrubs Academy, a four day/three night camp held on the University of North Dakota campus in June of every year. The Scrubs Academy encourages middle school students from across North Dakota to pursue a career in healthcare. Students participate in hands-on activities and receive information related to a variety of healthcare professions. In addition to the experiences with healthcare professionals, students are certified in Friends and Family CPR and the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA).

Along with sending Jr. High students to Scrubs Academy, the Foundation has helped put on for the past two years, along with the Stanley High School and UND Center for Rural Health, a Scrubs Camp for the Sr. High. This is a one day event held locally for the entire Stanley High School where nine presenters from the medical field come into classroom setting for the day.

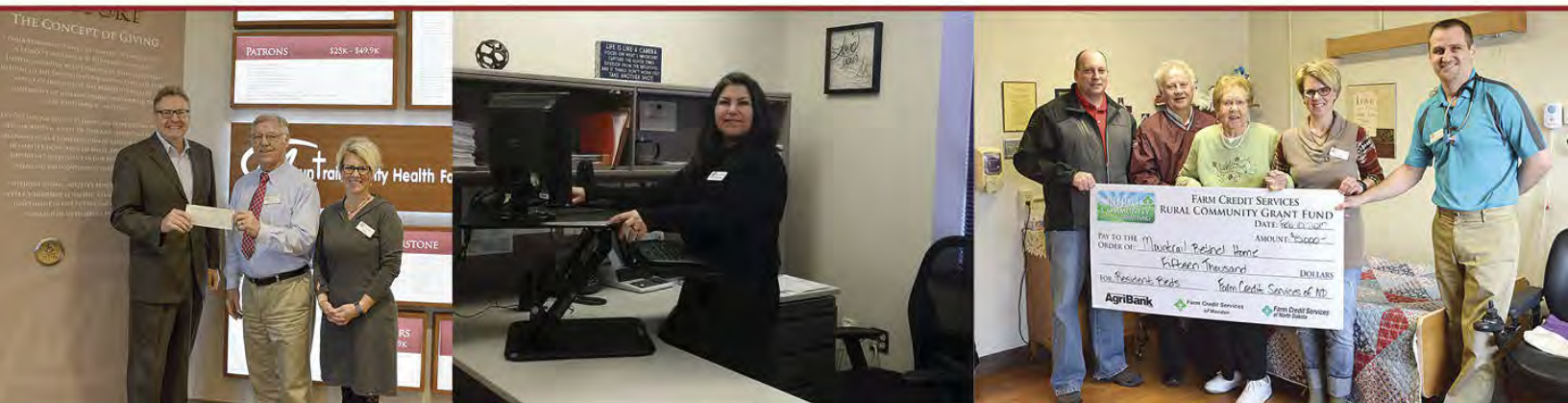

We also want to thank everyone who has been a part of this wonderful event over the years. With their help we have been able to raise \$46,395 over the past four years.



The T.H. Reiarson Trust can only give funding to the Mountrail County Medical Center (MCMC) for improvements and equipment.



Mr. Reiarson was a life-long farmer who lived south of Ross. In his Last Will and Testament, he created this trust for the benefit of the Stanley Community Hospital. T.H. was specific in his will that the trust be prudently managed by the SCH board. This trust has been helping with improvements for the hospital since the late 1970's. He would also be amazed at how his trust could help pay for the following over the last four years:

- \$2,410,406.60 for the building of the T.H. Reiarson Rural Health Clinic
- \$1,547,401.33 for the Electronic Healthcare Records systems
- \$241,290.62 for signage, furnishing and technology for the new clinic, such as the new electronic billboard.
- \$11,080.00 for the new www.stanleyhealth.org website
- \$251,952.42 for equipment for the hospital and clinic such as a portable ultra-sound, Nurses' Call Station, CT Scanner, Bathing System, Bobcat and accessories, Ophthalmoscopes for ER, Urine Analyzer, CR Reader for X-Ray and a Glidescope.
- \$1,837.47 for training for Hospital and Clinic Billing Staff
